Harrisonburg, VA –Park View Federal Credit Union has been awarded with first place in the state for the Dora Maxwell Social Responsibility Award. The award honors credit unions for their social responsibility work and community service. This is the second year in a row PVFCU has won the award.

PVFCU won the award for its 3rd annual Community Connection held on Nov. 11, 2015. PVFCU lived out their heritage of “Neighbors Serving Neighbors” by observing Veteran’s Day in active service to the community, to show their appreciation to many who have served the community, country and world. Volunteers helped with tasks such as fall yard and garden work, sorting donations and books, food preparation, maintenance projects, cleaning, office work, and wood splitting.
